

Eliminating Wordiness

Long sentences are not necessarily wordy, nor are short sentences always concise.

A sentence is wordy if its meaning can be conveyed in fewer words.

Here are some tips for eliminating wordiness in your writing:

> ELIMINATE REDUNDANCIES

WORDY: Daniel is now employed at a private rehabilitation center working as a registered physical therapist.

REVISED: Daniel works at a private rehabilitation center as a registered physical therapist.

> AVOID UNNECESSARY REPETITION OF WORDS

WORDY: The best teachers help each student to become a better student both academically and emotionally.

REVISED: The best teachers help each students grow both academically and emotionally.

> CUT EMPTY OR INFLATED PHRASES

WORDY: In my opinion, our current immigration policy is misguided on several counts. REVISED: Our current immigration policy is misguided on several counts.

> AVOID EMPTY, COLORLESS VERBS (ESPECIALLY "TO BE")

WORDY: The administrative secretary is responsible for monitoring and balancing the budget. REVISED: The administrative secretary monitors and balances the budget.

> AVOID JARGON

WORDY: For years, the indigenous body politic of South Africa attempted to negotiate legal enfranchisement without result.

REVISED: For years, the indigenous people of South Africa negotiated in vain for the right to vote.
