

## Getting Ready for your Research Paper Step Five – Outlining

The outline will help you **structure** the research paper and **stay focused** on developing the main idea of the paper. <u>Start by writing a **working thesis statement**</u>. Use this to guide the entire outline and paper.

## INTRODUCTION

Identify the subject/explain the problem
Provide background information
Frame a thesis statement (main idea/purpose of the paper)

## BODY

Analyze/Examine/Interpret the subject
Develop/Compare first, second, third major idea/issue/argument/etc.

<u>SUPPORT</u> main ideas (evidence, facts, examples, etc.)

Restate your thesis statement Remind audience of your position Provide solutions, answers, final opinions

## CONCLUSION

**Outlining Model** \*note: Ask your instructor about the format of the outline he/she wants you to use (i.e.; topic or sentence outline, formal or informal outline, etc.)
